Describing pictures



Introduction including general description: What is happening in the picture? Where is the action happening? Other relevant aspects (depending on each picture).

Description of people: what they are doing, their relationship (guess from context)
General description of clothes (relevant to the picture). Some detailed description of one or two people (maximum), including age, hair, clothes, and personal impressions. Do not describe all the people one by one if there are more than two or three people. Instead, try to find common characteristics, or use comparatives.

The story behind the picture: why was the picture taken? What happened before/ after the picture was taken? Was anything happening that cannot be seen in the picture?

Optional : personal experience. How does your personal experience relate to the picture? (This part should not take too long nor become the main aspect of the description and should only be introduced once the rest of the aspects have been clearly covered)

Conclusion: personal impression about the picture.
