

### **Present Tenses**

TENSE	USE	TIMELINE	EXAMPLE
Present Simple	Habitual actions/states	XXXXXXX Past Present Fu	Birds <u>usually</u> nest in trees.
Present Continuous	Actions happening now	Past Present Fu	You are <u>now</u> reading this.
Present Perfect	Achievements	Past Present Fu	I have passed all my tests so far.
Present Perfect Continuous	Actions starting in the past until now	Past Present Fu	You have been studying Iture English <u>for</u> the past 25 years.



## **Past Tenses**

TENSE	USE	T	IMELINE		EXAMPLE(S)
Past Simple	Expresses that something happened at a specific time in the past	X Past	Present	Future	We ate out there <u>last night</u> . <u>Then</u> , my car broke down.
Past Continuous	Longer past actions interrupted	Past	Present	Future	At 7 AM, I was having a shower. Someone rang while I was studying.
Past Perfect	Expresses something happened before a specific point in the past	Past	Present	Future	When I got home, the thieves had already left.
Past Perfect Continuous	Actions starting in the past up to a point in the present	Past	Present	Future	By the time I got served, I had been waiting tin the queue <u>for</u> an hour.

## **Final Notes**

#### \* Simple VS Continuous Tenses

- \* Please note that we cannot use <u>state verbs</u> (be, have, own...) with continuous tenses.
- \* To express continuous aspect (i.e. DURATION) with state verbs, we need to use the simple equivalent.
- \* For example:
- \* I am owing 5 euros.  $\rightarrow$  I owe 5 euros.
- \* I am seeing a tree.  $\rightarrow$  I can see a tree.
- ★ It've been having my car for 2 years. → I've had my car for 2 years.
